PhD in Sanskrit language or related field; experience (with evidence) of teaching Sanskrit language and literature at the university level; experience in curriculum development; knowledge of integrating technology in language teaching; demonstrated commitment to academic research; high level of competency in Sanskrit and English; knowledge of Sanskrit literature; experience in developing students' insights into Sanskrit structures and improving their skills in reading and interpreting Sanskrit texts; high level of fluency and ability to teach a second South Asian or Indo-Iranian language, including literature.

Desirable Qualifications

Any suitable combination of the following: Ability to teach in ancillary areas such as literature, film, and popular culture; experience in conceptualizing a language program; successful experience in working with peers and administrators, as substantiated by peer evaluations and/or professional references.
