Recto and verso of the first leaf of a small (18 x 4 cm) palm leaf manuscript in Sanskrit written in the Malayalam script. The manuscript has once belonged to an unidentified Nambudiri Brahmin family of Kerala belonging to the Taittirīya Yajurvedins. The first leaf records the *Varuṇasūkta* (fol. 1a) and the *Rudrasūkta* (fol. 1a–b) of this school, each consisting of five verses, all but one taken from the *Ṛgveda* to Taittirīya texts (those marked with an asterisk having variant readings):

*hariḥ om* (in the margin of fol. 1a)
