Job Description:

Tasks of the successful applicant will include support of the professorship in Modern South Asian Studies in research, teaching and administration as well as independent research and teaching of two two-hour courses per semester, as specified in the description of the profile of applicants. Independent research with the aim of further post-doctoral academic qualification (habilitation) is particularly desired.

Profile:

Applicants should have a doctorate/PhD in the area of Modern South Asian Studies or a related discipline with a focus on modern South Asia. Their research should focus on a field in cultural and social studies. Excellent knowledge of at least one modern language of northern South Asia (preferably Hindi or Nepali) is expected. Applicants should be able to offer their own courses within the BA curriculum "Languages and Cultures of South Asia and Tibet" and the interdisciplinary MA curriculum "Culture and Society in Modern South Asia" in the areas of culture, society, history, language, and religion. Applicants should also be ready to participate in departmental administration, student support, and examinations.

Very good knowledge of English and familiarity with application software commonly used in the discipline. Applicants who do not have German as their mother tongue should demonstrate good active and very good passive knowledge of German.
