## Dear Sir/Madam,

The Oriental Institute, The M. S. University of Baroda, Vadodara invites original innovative unpublished articles on Indological Studies: Veda, Purāṇa, Itihāsa, Literature (Sanskrit), Archaeology, Iconography, ancient Indian sciences, Philosophy and Unpublished manuscripts. Since you are a scholar of your concerned field, we would like you to send an article on any of the above mentioned sections for our forthcoming 69<sup>th</sup> Volume of the Journal.

## **Guidelines:**

- 1. Articles should be only in English with ample margin; the Contributor should write only his name (no adjective or designation) at the right side below the Title. Down at the end of first page in Foot-notes, should mention his official postal address with Mobile No. and Email ID.
- 2. In the article, for English language, Font name **-Times New Roman**, size 12 (Heading 16, subtitles 14 in Bold), Foot-note font size 10, for *Devanāgarī* (Sanskrit) in **Unicode** in Font, Size 10.
- 3. The **Titles** of **Sanskrit/Non-Sanskrit works** in transliteration should be **in** *Italics* while printing (should be dictated by underlining the word if not done by the author) with proper diacritical marks e.g. *Ŗgveda*, *Śvetāśvara Upaniṣad*, *Rāmāyaṇa*, *History of Sanskrit Poetics*, *Rāmacaritamānasa* etc.
- 4. The names of certain **General classes** of **works** in transliteration should **not be in** *italics* e.g. Vedas, Upanişads, Purāņas, Upapurāņas, Mahātmya, Itihāsa, Nyāya, Kośa (but with diacritical marks).

- 5. But the names of **certain classes of works** in transliteration should **be in** *Italics* except last 's' showing plurality, e.g. *Jātakas*, *Paňcarātrāgamas* etc.
- 6. **Abbreviations of the titles of Sanskrit works** should **not be in Italics**, e.g. RV (for *Rgveda*), SV (*Sāmaveda*), YV (*Yajurveda*), AV (*Atharvaveda*), Mbh (*Mahābhārata*), BG (*Bhagavad Gītā*), NS (*Nātyaśāstra*) (or any other Abb. created for any Sanskrit works).
- 7. **Proper names** in transliteration, **should not be in Italics** e.g. Rāma, Sītā, Bhāsa, Kālidāsa, Bhavabhuti, Pāṇini, (names of deities) Indra, Agni, Varuṇa, Viṣṇu, Śiva, Umā, Durgā, Rudra, Kṛṣṇa, Gaṅgā, Yamunā etc. and the **names of places** e.g. Prayāga, Mathurā, Bhārata, Mithilā (but with diacritical marks).
- 8. **Epithets** (adjectives) in transliteration should **be in Italics** e.g. *Paulasatya, Kārtavirya, Cakravartī, Siddharāja, Prajāpati* (in general sense).
- 9. In the body of the 'article', Non-English **stray words**/ **Sanskrit/Prakrit lines**/ **verses** must be written in transliteration (Roman), **in** *Italics* and with proper diacritical marks.
- 10. The Sanskrit quotations (verses/slokas) if quoted in quarter/half/full line in text body or Foot-noted should be in 'Devanāgari script' (not Roman).
- 11. Whenever an Abbreviation is used in an article, its full form should be stated in first occurrence and then that abridged form may be used for that full form in all over the article.
- 12. Foot notes, numbered consecutively throughout the article should appear at the bottom of the page. The sequence of the reference should be -1. Author or Editor's name surname first then initials, 2. Name of the book/periodical / Journal (in italics), 3. Publisher, 4. Place and Year, 5. Page no. Incomplete or unauthentic references will be removed from the article. Year of publication added in brackets in 'Text body' with name of the author is barred. The desired information can be added in Foot-notes indicated by number for the attributed term.
- 14. The type written articles/papers should be submitted on A-4 size paper (typed on one side) addressed to -

The article should be sent through e-mail preferably MS word format with PDF copy also, (Font size 12) should be sent at - oimsu1927@gmail.com

- 15. The Article should be supported by the 'Abstract 'of the paper and 'Key words' used in the article. At the end of the article, the 'bibliography' should be added.
- 16. The views expressed in any article will solely belong to the contributor. The Editorial board will not be responsible for any published controversial opinion in the article. To over-rule the plagiarism, the articles will be scanned by Orkut/shodhganga software. In case of plagiarism, the judicial process may be followed by the effected party. The Oriental Institute will not be liable for it.
- 17. The Copyright of all articles published in the Journal will rest with the Oriental Institute.
- 18. A contributor will be provided the complimentary copy of the Journal along with 10 off prints of the article.
- 19. The articles will be reviewed by the experts (Blind review) other than our editorial board. After receiving the approval from the expert, the article will be considered for editing and publication. The reason for rejecting the article by reviewing scholar will not be disclosed.
- 20. The last date for submitting articles is 31st May 2020.
