St Andrews Encyclopaedia of Theology (SAET)

Golden opportunity for young scholars: get paid for publishing a peer-reviewed article

The University of St Andrews, Scotland (UK) is creating a new, online, freely accessible, international Encyclopaedia of Theology which incorporates intellectual content from all major religious traditions, including, of course, Hinduism. Ours is the first comprehensive encyclopaedia of theology that seeks to view the discipline from an emic perspective. You can find out more about us here: www.saet.ac.uk.

We are currently in the process of inviting scholarly authors to write articles for the Hinduism section from an emic point of view. Examples of article topics include *Mokṣa*, Śiva, Nyāya, Ahimsā, Kṛṣṇa, and Vedānta. Each article is supposed to be about 10,000 words long. We offer an honorarium of £300 per article to thank our authors for their contributions. We invite scholars of Indology / Hindu Studies / Sanskrit Studies including staff members (Professors, Lecturers etc.), graduate students (Research Masters and PhD candidates) and post-doctoral researchers to submit proposals for articles.

This is a brilliant opportunity for graduate students and other early career scholars to be recognized for their work and to make a significant research impact. Proposals should include your name and designation (if any), the title of the proposed article, a short description, and if possible, a list of publications (if any), and one or two writing samples. Please note that if your proposal is accepted, the deadline for submitting the final draft of your article would be the 31st of March 2024.
