Venue and Mode of Operation:



WSC 2027 will be held on the main campus of the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay. The conference will feature **21 regular thematic sections**, as stipulated by the IASS.

For each section, a team of invited convenors – renowned specialists in their fields – will ensure the conference's high scholarly standards by:

- Selecting individual papers for presentation.
- Organizing special featured panels.
- Appointing session chairs.

The convenors will also take the responsibilities for selecting and editing papers for publication in the conference proceedings.



Call for Papers and Panel Submissions:

WSC 2027 will host two types of sessions: individual paper sessions and special featured panels.

- Scholars may submit an abstract for an individual paper or propose a special panel of three or four participants.
- A scholar may submit either a paper individually or be a part of panel and not both.
- Each paper presentation will be allotted 20 minutes, followed by a 10-minute discussion.
- Full papers (only for Section 19) and Abstracts (for other sections) may be submitted either in English or in Sanskrit.
- The submission process will be only through the conference website.
